





The WSSA summer campout/meeting was held at the Blu-Shastin RV Park near Leavenworth on August 13th-15th. The meeting was productive and it was great spending time with friends and other WSSA members.

As most of you are now aware, WSSA's Snowmobile and Power Sports Expo is happening again this year but is now on Friday and Saturday, October 14th-15th, and I hope everyone takes advantage of it by attending and visiting vendors, friends, clubs and to buy and sell as much as you can.

I'm also very happy to report WSSA is hosting the annual Winter Rendezvous in February over Presidents Day Weekend in Yakima, February 17th-20th, at the Yakima Valley Museum. Please stay tuned to the WSSA Snoflyer for more details to come soon so you can book your hotel room and Rendezvous tickets.

I attended the annual Snowmobile Advisory Committee (SMAC) summer funding meeting virtually on August 6th where a budget was approved for this season's grooming program. I'm happy to announce the committee recommended increasing grooming funding even though sled registrations were down slightly. Please keep registering your sleds so we can continue to provide grooming to our trails throughout Washington. Please remember even though your sled registration is only \$50.00, we actually get \$94.20 toward our snowmobile program for every sled registered. That is because we also receive a portion of the gas tax from the fuel used in our sleds. You also get a free sno-park parking pass with every snowmobile registered. Your money pays for trail grooming, sno-park snow removal, sanitation, law enforcement, education and administration, so please register your snowmobiles and snowbikes. (And tracked ATVs/ UTVs - ed.)

Please start thinking about getting ready for this coming snowmobile season. Start ordering any of those needed parts, accessories and clothing. Along with that, please check your overall sled for needed repairs or

adjustments. Check your safety equipment such as avalanche backpacks, beacons, probes, shovels, radios, and start getting educated by taking an avalanche awareness class and even go further and take a level-1 avalanche safety class; it may save your life or your riding partner's life! Also start thinking about your snowmobile trailer repairs and maintenance such as wheel bearings, tire pressures, tire wear, license, and lights.

Now is also a great time to start looking at purchasing a new snowmobile, sled deck, or trailer from a local dealer as the sled inventory might be limited again this year. Stop in and see the great guys at I-90 Motorsports in Issaquah for Ski-Doo snowmobiles and all your clothing and accessories; https://www.i-90motorsports.com/. More on this as the plan moves forward.

The Upper County Recreation Association (UCRA) spent most of the 2022 calendar year establishing by-laws and receiving its Federal tax exemption status. UCRA is a grant-funded association focusing on projects that impact outdoor recreation in Kittitas County. groups/920574301897777. Currently we are working with The Nature Conservancy on opening up the Patrick Mine Road off of State Route 903 for groomer access and winter recreation only. UCRA is eagerly anticipating this road to be opened hopefully

this year. It is a significant project and we appreciate everyone's involvement in making this happen. UCRA's second project is working through the U.S. Forest Service and Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to open an abandoned snowmobile trail that will connect the Blewett Pass and Mission Ridge snowmobile trail systems. This project will require many hours of trail brushing and tree cutting to clear a trail for groomer access. This access will be open to yearround motorized use, however, because the trail does approach the Ellensburg watershed, DNR will have a gate to mediate access during times of extreme mud/foul weather.

Keep your eyes open via social media to look for 'Snowmobile Day' sponsored by the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA). The UCRA has applied to their grant foundation to receive funds for this event. We will have the newest snowmobile videos, beer, games, snowmobile vendors and smiling faces. The event will be held locally here in Cle Elum. More details to follow.

WSSA Celebrates 50 Years

Recognizes Longest Standing

As WSSA celebrates its 50th year, we want to recognize a member who has held membership in WSSA since its inception. Dora Wolfe became a member of WSSA when it was formed in 1972 and has held a variety of positions in the organization over the past 50 years. She has held a variety of positions in



several clubs and other organizations over the years, as well. We are high-lighting several of Dora's contributions in support of WSSA and snowmobiling.

Dora held the position of Secretary-Treasurer for four years, Treasurer for three years and Membership Chair for 12 years. She also served as the District Chair for District 5 North for several terms and chaired the WSSA Convention Committee in 1980 and co-chaired the committee when the convention was held in Ellensburg in 1995. She served on the committee that developed the state's snowmobile registration program in 1970 – two years before WSSA was formally chartered! Other activities include serving on the Expo Committee for several years where she coordinated the Expo prize drawings and she served as the Treasurer of the Snomobile WA Political Action Committee for 15 years, making sure the required reports were submitted to the Public Disclosure Commission. Dora was certified as a snowmobile safety instructor in 1977 and taught many snowmobile safety classes over the years. She has actively supported grooming program improvements throughout the years and was instrumental in getting the French Cabin Sno-Park established.

In addition to the WSSA activities, Dora was active in several snowmobile clubs. She was a charter member of the Cascade Drift Skippers and held membership and served in several offices with the Cle Elum Ridge Ryders, Snomads, Polar Bears (now in hibernation) and Yakima Ski-Benders. In 2000, Dora was named WSSA's Snowmobiler of the Year and was recognized by the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) as the ACSA Snowmobiler of the Year, competing with her peers across the nation.

Dora currently resides in the Spokane area. As snowmobilers, we extend our appreciation to Dora for her commitment to snowmobiling for the past 50 plus years!

From the International Snowmobile Tourism Council And the International Snowmobile Media Council


The International Snowmobile Tourism Council (ISTC) and the International Snowmo-bile Media Council (ISMC) want to bring to the attention of all snowmobilers the tres-passing issue.

Trespassing on private land is more prevalent in the Midwest and Northeast than in the West as there is more public land in the West, but regardless, all snow-mobilers need to respect private land as the use of it is a privi-

lege and not a right. If you trespass on private land you add to the reason we lose trails and other riding areas. When you see a No Tres-passing sign, do not go there; respect the landowner's right to keep any-one he wishes off his land.

In the words of the American Council of Snow-mobile Associations, "Know Where To Go Or There Will Be NOwhere To Go!"





KNOW BEFORE YOU GO - Avalance edition

From the International Snowmobile Tourism Council And the International Snowmobile Media Council

The ISTC and the ISMC want to bring to the attention of all snowmobilers riding in the West, how important it is to KNOW BEFORE YOU GO. We strongly urge snowmobilers to check the avalanche forecast before heading out no matter where you ride in the West. You have the training (Are You Beeping?) and the tools but DID YOU CHECK THE AVALANCHE FORECAST? Very easy to do: go to www.avalanche.org and click on the state you are going to ride in. The Midwest and Northeast riders especially need to be aware of this when they head west to ride as this would likely not be part of their normal routine. Read the avalanche forecast before every ride. Know what the avalanche problems or the bottom-line summary says for your riding area. If you get buried in an avalanche, it takes about ten minutes to die.

You can look at the avalanche statistics from last season on the ACSA website www.snowmobilers.org. They were compiled by Mike Duffy, one of the top avalanche experts in the U.S. Also, on the ACSA website is Snowmobile Education and Safety. KNOW BEFORE YOU GO, and live to ride another day.







Register your snowmobile and receive a FREE Sno-Park permit. Relax and enjoy this winter season without risk of a citation for not being registered or for not having a Sno-Park permit.

Your \$50 registration fee and money collected from a gas tax refund are put into a dedicated fund account for the Snowmobile Program.

The gas tax refund is computed using the following formula: 135 gallons (average yearly fuel usage per snowmobile) x .349 cents per gallon of gas x the annual number of registered snowmobiles and snowbikes.

The gas tax refund and registration fees collected each year add up to approximately \$94.20 per snowmobile or snowbike to fund the program. Fees collected this year are put towards next year's snowmobile season to pay for trail grooming, snow removal, sanitation, administration, education and enforcement.

The U.S. Forest Service is resuming its practice of intentionally lighting fires to clear brush and small trees from forested areas nationwide after a three-month hiatus to review the risks of runaway wildfires under increasingly severe climate conditions, the agency recently announced.

The prescribed fire program was put on hold in late May in the midst of a devastating wildfire sparked by the federal government near Las Vegas, New Mexico, that burned across more than 500 square miles through remote communities in the southern reaches of the Rocky Mountains.

Forest Service Chief Randy Moore said prescribed burns will require new safeguards such as same-day authorization to keep pace with evolving weather and ground conditions.

Will BLM Headquarters Be Allowed to Move To D.C.?

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) may have to slow down its plan to move headquarters employees back to Washington D.C. by the end of next year.

The National Treasury Employees Union (NTEU) chapter, representing BLM's headquarters staffers, formally notified the BLM this week that federal labor statutes require the agency to negotiate with the union over the terms and conditions of the plan outlined this week by BLM Director Tracy Stone-Manning to move dozens of headquarters employees back to the District of Columbia.

This week the BLM Director sent an e-mail to HQ staffers for all non-supervisory employees to move back to D.C. by September, 2023.

"There's nothing about the director's e-mail yesterday that has been bargained or even informally discussed with the union," Panchita Paulete, NTEU Chapter 341's interim president, said in an interview.

BLM headquarters staffers voted in May to join the union, and the NTEU formally certified it as a chapter of the union on June 6th. It comprises 200 non-supervisory headquarters employees, most of whom are currently located outside of Washington and would be directly affected by Stone-Manning's relocation plan, Paulete said.

Changes at Patagonia

Yvon Chouinard, founder of Patagonia, announced recently he is giving away the outdoor-apparel company, which is reportedly valued at about \$3 billion — an unorthodox move aimed at combating the climate crisis.

In a letter published on the company's website, Chouinard wrote ownership of the company has been transferred to a trust that was "created to protect the company's values" as well as a nonprofit organization "dedicated to fighting the environmental crisis and defending nature."

In Choinard's letter he states, "100% of the company's voting stock transfers to the Patagonia Purpose Trust, created to protect the company's values; and 100% of the non-voting stock had been given to the Holdfast Collective, a nonprofit dedicated to fighting the environmental crisis and defending nature. The funding will come from Patagonia: Each year, the money we make after reinvesting in the business will be distributed as a dividend to help fight the crisis."

Did You Know?

U.S. Senator Jeff Merkley (D-OR) has introduced two bills intended to mitigate the effects of wildfire smoke. The Smoke-Ready Communities Act and the Smoke Planning and Research Act received a hearing in front of the Environment and Public Works committee.

Dr. Cassandra Moseley, a professor in the Institute for a Sustainable Environment, spoke to the committee, saying "Wildfire smoke is rapidly increasing public health risk, affecting not only rural communities that are located near these fires, but increasingly in major urban centers hundreds or even thousands of miles away. Households and individuals need to be prepared to act quickly when smoke arrives, and yet many lack the information about the practical steps they can take to keep themselves safe."





A U.S. company best known for shipping wood pellets to energy producers in Europe has reached a deal to turn some of its forest products into aviation fuel.

Enviva Inc. said its agreement with Alder Fuels will send as much as 750,000 metric tons of forest thinnings and other material to a new production facility to be built in the Southeast beginning in 2024.

The arrangement provides an additional outlet for lower-value material taken from commercial logging operations and forest management projects, which supporters of a more intensive approach say is critical to making such forest work cost-effective.

Major U.S. airlines have pledged to reach net-zero emissions by 2050, and the Biden administration has set a goal of producing 35 billion gallons of sustainable aviation fuel by then. Congress further promoted the fuel in the recently passed Inflation Reduction Act with a production tax credit.

However, some environmental groups question the carbon benefits of converting woody biomass to energy, questioning emitting more carbon pollution than fossil fuels per unit energy, and net emissions persist for decades to centuries.

U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigleg joined Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer recently to announce a \$105 million federal grant to remove a freeway, replacing it with a surface street as part of an urban renewal project.

South Korean battery maker LG Energy Solution and Japanese automaker Honda announced a \$4.4 billion joint venture in the United States to produce batteries for Honda EVs in the North American market.

In Case You Missed This....

With California's energy grid unable to meet demand, four emergency gas-powered generators were called on to ease the strain on the state's power grid.

Recently, the California Independent System Operator, which manages the state's electricity flow, put out a statement in which Elliot Mainzer, president and chief executive of the California Independent System Operator, said demand reduction was essential.

"We need a reduction in energy use that is two or three times greater than what we've seen so far as this historic heat wave continues to intensify," he said.

"The grid does not currently have the capability to add millions of battery electric or even fuel-cell electric vehicles today," he said, according to CBS.

General Motors shut down pickup plants this week. A Missouri plant that builds midsize pickups and big vans was closed along with other plants that make small and midsize SUVs.

"These recent scheduling adjustments are being driven by the continued parts shortages caused by semiconductor supply constraints from international markets experiencing Covid-19-related restrictions," GM said in a statement.

I'd hate to be in charge at Polaris **right now...** Hey, it happens to the best of us, but having 230,000 snowmobiles recalled on your watch for fire danger isn't a good thing. With degraded fuel and extended storage, '21-'23 MATRYX, '15-'22 AXYS, and certain '13-'14 Pro-Ride models may catch fire due to electrostatic discharge igniting fuel vapors inside the tank. Polaris says park 'em til they can fix 'em. (Wonder how many will ride them anyway?...)

But it gets worse... In late August, '22 Patriot Boost models were recalled for a bad clutch bolt that may break and create a projectile risk. At least the number affected is only about 3,300.

New Arctic Cat chassis! Shown at Hay Days and promised to be lighter and stronger with a focus on mass centralization. Easier to service is claimed too! The new 'Catalyst' chassis will be here in 2024... but only offered with 600cc engines in the first year. (This seems to annoy diehard Car owners.)

BRP/Ski-Doo riding high! They just posted the best revenue numbers in their history, a net income of \$237.7 million in the second quarter, a 12% increase from a year ago. Supply chain-easing and massive demand since 2020 are the largest contributors. (If they don't bring back a [real] 600 Summit, they lose my future dollars.)
